Belper Town Football Club is the town's semi-professional football club.

The club currently competes in the **Northern Premier League** and plays their home matches at **Christchurch Meadow**.

The club is affectionately known as the "Nailers", a nod to the town's historical nail-making industry.

Additionally, Belper Town Juniors, an affiliated junior club, provides coaching and competitive football for young players whilst a thriving ladies section is also affiliated to the main club.

With mixed and girls-only teams across various age groups, Belper Town Juniors have around **400 registered players** from U7's to U18's, as well as a development club for children aged five and above.

Belper Town FC's Raygar Stadium hosts competitive football matches on its main pitch but also boasts a smaller artificial grass pitch which is used by all sections of the club, particularly the Juniors, but is available for use by other local football teams.

The stadium also incorporates a busy Conference Centre (also known as Nailers) which hosts commercial events and private parties and is
